Post-Operative Instructions after Knee Arthroscopy

You should already have an appointment for suture removal in our office within 2 weeks of surgery. If not, be sure to call and schedule one.

- Leave your post-operative dressing on for 2 days. After 2 days, you may remove your dressing and apply a clean, dry dressing. Daily dry dressing changes are recommended.
- You may take a shower, however be sure to cover the sutures with saran wrap so they do not get wet. Do not soak in a tub or go swimming.
- Please keep your incision sites clean and dry. Do not apply any ointments to your incisions.
- Elevate the affected knee with two pillows UNDER THE ANKLE as tolerated. Discontinue when comfortable.
- Use ice for 3-4 days. You should use it at least 3-4 times daily for 15-20 minutes each. Apply as soon as possible. Do not apply ice directly to the wound, wrap in a towel or wash cloth to prevent moisture to the incision.
- Despite great care, any incision can become infected. Contact the office immediately if you develop fever, chills, redness to the incision sites, or drainage from the incision sites.
- You were given a prescription for physical therapy when you scheduled your surgery.
 Please arrange for physical therapy to begin the day following your surgery.
- You were given a prescription for pain medication following your surgery. Please take pain medication as prescribed.
